Damage Action Names Two Firms

FAIRFIELD—A \$40,000 complaint for damages was filed in Superior Court yesterday by J. N. Campos, Fairfield grocer, against two Sacramento firms who allegedly caused a fire which destroyed the Food Fair at 735 Texas street, April 26, 1946.

Named as defendants were the Sacramento Asbestos Co. and the J. N. Blair Co. Campos charged that they carelessly and negligently burned, destroyed and damaged the concrete building together with tools, equipment and supplies at an estimated value of \$40,000. He asked the court to award him full damages. Russell A. Harris, Sacramento attorney, filed the complaint.



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
