Mr. [REDACTED] has been under my observation since about 1930, and upon my original examination of him he showed, in my opinion, definite symptoms for lead poisoning.

Mr. [REDACTED] was operated on at Mayo Clinic for Lumbar Sympathetic Ganglionectomy in 1932, Cervical Sympathetic Ganglionectomy in 1933, and on account of still further trouble with the extremities, amputation of the left limb was performed in June 1934, also at the Mayo Clinic, Rochester, Minnesota.

Since that time his right foot has become again involved, and after examination at the Mayo Clinic June 9th and 10th, 1935, and because Mr. McDonnell was totally disabled and the tendency of the ulcers to recur in spite of treatment, an amputation of the right leg was advised.

Mr. [REDACTED] returned to Canton and in consultation with Dr. Schuffell and myself, was advised that Dr. Schuffell and I concurred with the Mayo's recommendation.

Amputation of the right foot below the knee was performed June 19th 1935.

I think this case is worthy of reconsideration.
