

E. Safety Instruction

Contractor shall maintain an educational program which contains safety instructions as included herein, per the Contract Administrator, and any special expertise safety requirements which are part of the job assignment.

F. Orderliness

Work areas must be kept clean and orderly, with cords and hoses routed across walkways in a manner that will present no tripping hazard. Materials, tools, and equipment must be stored in a stable position (tied, stacked, or chocked) to prevent rolling or falling. A safe accessway to all work areas must be maintained. Barricade all work and material equipment storage areas.

G. Inspections and Testing

1. A work area check must be made daily at the beginning and end of each shift to insure safe conditions*, and to be sure that all flames are extinguished.
2. All applicable Federal, State, and/or local safety codes must be followed.
3. New or repaired piping will be tested in accordance with a test procedure furnished by the Contract Administrator.
4. New or replaced electrical work will be inspected by Site electrical supervision (scheduled by the Contract Administrator). When specified, on new buildings or large renovations, the Contractor shall have the installation inspected by a "Certified Inspection Agency".

* Possession of a valid permit, stable shoring, safe access and egress, etc.

5. All equipment installed by the Contractor shall be cleaned and lubricated or sealed as required by the Contract Administrator before the equipment is energized.

IV. PERSONNEL PROTECTION

Suitable protective equipment required for Contractor's personnel such as clothing, eye protection, gloves, respiratory equipment, hard hats, hearing protection, toe protection, etc., shall be provided by the Contractor and worn where required by OSHA, the Contract Administrator, and as defined herein.

THE CONTRACTOR CAN AVOID COSTLY DELAY IN PROCEEDING WITH HIS WORK BY ASSURING THAT ALL PERSONNEL REPORT WITH THE REQUIRED PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT

Contractor shall train and require his employees to wear appropriate personal protective equipment that is maintained in good condition. Contractor's employees shall not commence work until proper protective equipment is worn.

Rings, bracelets, dangling pierced ear lobe earrings, long neck chains and continuous wrist straps shall *not* be worn near moving machinery or where mechanical electrical work is being done. Tied long neckties (not tucked in), buttoned or loose long sleeves, or other loose clothing or items, including hair or beards long enough to be considered a hazard by the Contract Administrator shall not be worn when working on or near moving machinery in posted areas.
