

black personnel under limited by a committee of students and parents and a minimum requirement to increase the number of black applicants for teaching positions.

Noting that school officials say they are having difficulty finding qualified black teachers, Brown maintained, "We can teach them how to teach. Black teachers are essential. A black teacher understands black children. You've done a very good job for Spanish people. We really need to move into the area of black people."

Hornbeck countered by saying, "The district is doing something about it" and supported his contention with these statistics:

In the hiring of new teachers for this year, 27% were black and 54% were white and to fill vacancies after school started 21% of the teachers hired were black and 68% were white.

47% Black

For next year, so far, Hornbeck noted that 47% of the new teachers hired are black and 25% are white.

He said there are 42% minority teachers in the district as compared to a student minority population of 47%.

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Glendale Sets Override Vote, Students to Help

GLENDALE — The Board of Education has set Oct. 12 for a tax override election. And students, eager for a return to a full day school program, plan a "Walk for Education" Saturday to raise money to promote passage of the ballot proposition.

Trustees of the Glendale Unified and Community College Districts approved the special tax election after hearing of the plan by students to help the district on its financial difficulties.

For lack of sufficient revenues, school programs were drastically reduced in 1967 and again in 1970.

Five-Period Day

All junior high school students and half those in the senior highs are on a shortened five-period day. Summer school, except for limited classes for a small number of students needing graduation credits, has been canceled. More than 100 teacher positions have been eliminated along with cuts in counseling, building maintenance and educational health programs.
