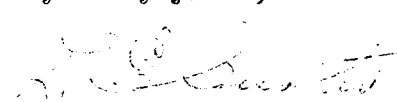

I have reviewed your proposal and have one rather serious objection to it. On Page 6, you mention the minutes of the San Francisco meeting of April 8. My statement was to the effect that from the company standpoint the heavy load of medical examinations might be less if all of the biological tests were well within normal limits. I fully recognize that from the standpoint of the final report, special examination is practically a "must" for your purposes.
