Subject: Medical Requirements for Fire Building Inspector
Classification

Pursuant to our conversation of February 4, 1981, it is my understanding that Corporate policy advises that a physical examination should be considered when the F.B.I. classification is to use a breathing apparatus which restricts or impedes breathing. The determination of whether breathing is restricted or impeded is to be made by the Plant physician, as is any subsequent medical examinations or tests. It is also my understanding that if the Plant physician determines that the breathing apparatus does not restrict or impede breathing, no medical examination is advised.

In compliance with these understandings, the Livonia Plant physician has examined the breathing apparatus designated for use by Livonia Plant F.B.I. personnel (Bio-Pak-60, a self-contained unit) and has determined that it does not impede or restrict breathing. Therefore, no medical examination will be required of personnel designated to use this equipment.

Please contact me if you are not in agreement with the foregoing.
