Bill,

I think I tracked "finalizing" vs. "finalized" down. First off, Kerry Rae did not send around the new template until the day before the meeting setting off a mad scramble. This version from Bill Lukas is the first where the ANWR assessment appears including "finalizing". He states in his note that he is "Awaiting more current detail for ANWR. My info is from last Nov/Dec".

So either he wasn't able to get an update in the time available or the update didn't convey the fact that the contract for reprocessing 2D seismic had been finalized. And neither I nor the others who

received his email reviewed it and found the error (frankly, I don't think any of us knew until the question was posed whether the contract had been let).

The bigger issue with this 3-slide template for USGS was the strange list of priorities that they had already put in there for us, presumably something Andrea had used for an earlier briefing. We definitely need to get those fixed before the next one of these meetings.

I'm thinking it would suffice to let Bill L know verbally about what transpired and to make Judy and Joanne aware so that whoever does see the draft knows to double-check it as we are being held to a high standard of what gets put in front of the Secretary. Sigh.
