These photos were taken August 29, 1968/illustrate progress over the last ten working days.

Photo No. 1. Looks south, right foreground shows additional grading underway and spreading of rock sub-base for Sixth street west of tracks. Also visible are the newly installed dock levelers just to the left of the steps leading up to the warehouse floor. The roof is now installed, ventilators being installed (more in photo 4) and the siding erection is now underway with almost four bays covered.

Photo No. 2. Looks west. Erection of the full length siding panels is evident. Five roof ventilators are also seen in this picture.

Photo No. 3. Also looks west. The sun came out and we were a little over-exposed. Similar comments to Photo 2 otherwise.

Photo No. 4. Looks north from the third floor of Building 28. Roof ventilators being installed on the finished roof can be quite readily seen. More difficult to discern is the fact the flakers are in place, covered with plastic sheet, visible between and to the right of the two poles supporting the temporary transformer.

Photo No. 5. Pans to the left from photo 4 position. Most evident change here is progress on retaining wall around south end of railroad track. Electrically heated Therminol circulating unit will be installed west of tracks.

Photo No. 6. Looks east northeast. Footing visible at left margin is for 300 M gallon benzene tank dike. Area has been graded flat for tank foundation extending across the picture. Tank in background is the 200 M gallon refined Biphenyl storage tank.
