We have received a Notice of Hearing in connection with a Workmen's Compensation claim wherein it is alleged that Harvey Curtis, one of your former employees, has brought a compensation action against the Armstrong Contracting & Supply Company, alleging that in 1959 he sustained personal injury while working for your company and that later on in 1963 he was disabled as the result of occupational disease.

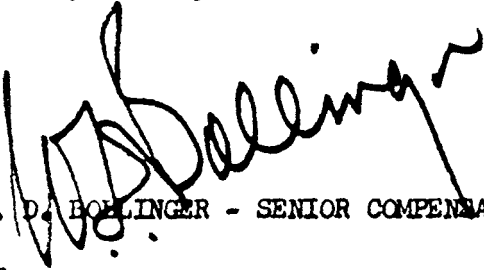
The insurance carrier Aetna Casualty & Surety Company has obtained an Order from the Workmen's Compensation Department adding parties defendant to this case. Our company the Standard Accident Insurance Company (now merged with Reliance Insurance Company) carried the Workmen's Compensation for your company at an earlier time and as a result, they are endeavoring to bring our company as well as several other employers and their insurance companies in on what we call Apportionment Proceedings. It is the contention of the attorneys representing Mr. Harvey Curtis that his poor health and the conditions bringing about his present disability developed in the course of the time that he worked for these various companies.

Therefore, at the suggestion of your Mr. R. Kelly in Detroit, I am requesting that you check your records to ascertain what years the employment records reveal that Harvey Curtis worked for you. I would also like to know when you do determine that, what his weekly wage amounted to, and whether or not there was ever any claim reported

for injury or sickness in the course of time he worked for you while we the Standard Accident Insurance Company, now the Reliance Insurance Company, carried the Workmen's Compensation Insurance for your company.

Time is of the essence in getting this information to us because we have about ten days in which to file an Appearance and Answer in the case pending before the Michigan Workmen's Compensation Department, so I would appreciate your early effort in checking into this along with a prompt reply so we will not have a tardy legal response to this pending litigation.

Gentlemen:

A Decision was rendered on 11-2-61, holding that Owens-Corning Fiberglass Co., the last employer, to be responsible for 50% of the Plaintiff's disability and finding that the remaining 50% was due to a non-occupational disease of life. This limited the liability in this matter to \$5250.00.

It had been Owens-Corning Fiberglass Company's intention to start Apportionment Proceedings against Armstrong Cork and other prior employers. However, before these Proceedings were instituted, the Michigan Supreme Court handed down the Trellsite Decision, holding the Apportionment Section of the Michigan Workmen's Compensation Act to be unconstitutional, thus leaving the Owens-Corning Fiberglass Company solely liable in this matter.

There have been certain expenses in connection with this matter and we are presently awaiting a statement of these expenses from the Attorney. Upon receipt of the statement, payment can be made and the file closed.

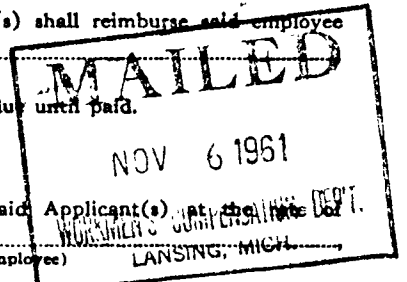

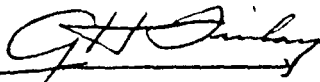

Harvey Curtis was employed as a pipe covering mechanic. These mechanics are hired through union halls ordinarily for the duration of a particular job. Under these conditions, they could conceivably work for a dozen or more employers during the course of several years.

Applications for employment and physical examinations were not a part of the hiring procedure and there were no personnel files kept for these mechanics.

Mr. R. A. Sigel, District Manager of Armstrong Contracting and Supply's (a subsidiary of Armstrong Cork Company) Detroit Office could explain to you the nature of these pipe covering mechanics' work and perhaps supply additional information which might be helpful.

Apparently since Armstrong Cork Company is not the last employer, it would only be involved in case the last employer petitioned for apportionment.

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of August 9, 1961, requesting a Status Report on the above matter.

This matter has been Noticed for Hearing on several occasions, however, on each Hearing Date it was adjourned. It finally came up for a Pre-Trial Conference on June 29, 1961 and at that time, the Plaintiff's Attorney produced a medical report of a Dr. William A. Davis that contained the following diagnosis:

- (1)- Arteriosclerotic Heart Disease
- (2)- Pulmonary Emphysema
- (3)- Pneumoconiosis

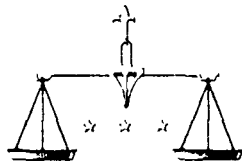
Since doctors have testified in similar cases that exposure to dust may cause emphysema, there is a sufficient question of fact in this case to possibly support a finding in his favor. As a result of this development, it was agreed between the various employers that the Plaintiff should be sent for further medical evaluation. Although I can not locate a file on a Harvey Curtis, I feel pretty sure that we have written you on this subject before. This involves a man who is making a claim against a large number of insulation contractors and their insurance carriers.

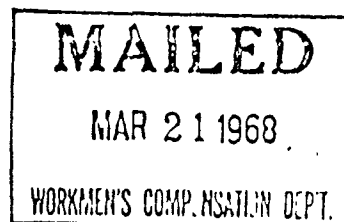

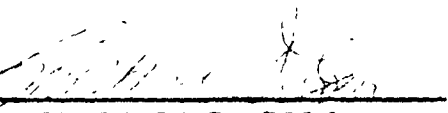
