GLEE CLUB SINGS FOR KIWANIS

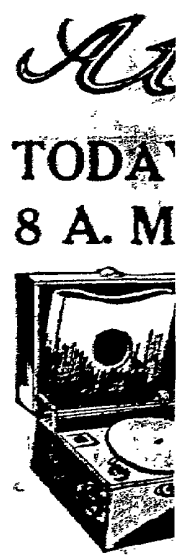
Trojan Group Warmly Ap-
