Dear Dr. Novy:

I am enclosing herewith the original copy of your report on [REDACTED] to which I have appended my signature and some comments. I enclose a carbon copy of my comments for your records.

I have gone to the trouble of discussing certain of the occupational aspects of the matter largely because of Dr. Watkins' statement with which I am not in full agreement.

I should like to call attention to the last paragraph of my comment. This diagnostic suggestion may seem a little far fetched, but I would be very much interested in the results of such an examination.

If I have stressed perhaps a little heavily the factor of psychoneurosis in this man, it is because I could not take too seriously his description of his edema and respiratory distress during the early part of his illness. I do not think he has more psychoneurosis than could be expected, but I do think that such a factor is a partial explanation of the apparent acuteness at the onset of his illness.

I have transmitted your message to Leblanc who asks me to return your greetings with his kindest regards.
