Dear Mr. VanHartesveldt:

The results on the urine and blood of your men came to my desk some time after our telephone conversation, and I am sending you a copy of the results, together with my comments, for your present information. The data as such may not mean anything to you, but you may as well have them at this time for the record. Unless you have some particular reason for doing otherwise, I would suggest that you leave to us any discussion of the meaning of these results with the individuals concerned.

You will be pleased to know, I am sure, that all these results are well within normal limits. They do not suggest that any of these men has absorbed any significant quantity of lead in the conduct of his work. We shall have to review the histories of the men carefully, before coming to any conclusion in relation to the hazardous qualities of your product, but as far as present evidence goes there is nothing to suggest that the work of these men has been dangerous.
