Moderate prominence of the right root. Some increased radiability in both uppers and in the left base. At the left base at this time are noted some pleural changes lying immediately above the diaphragm; these are not evident in the preceding film, #8894, taken 10/21/75. Lateral projection also suggests some alteration in the left leaf of the diaphragm, some tendency to blunt the costophrenic sulcus. Changes are not evident in the earlier film. Attention is directed to the history which indicates some pulmonary complaint and some change in the bowel habit. It should also be noted that ventilation studies have been decreased slightly over the previous study.
