My dear Dr. White:

Your letter of the 16th has arrived during Dr. Drinker's absence from the city. As you know, this laboratory has just completed a three-year study of the problem of lead poisoning, and a book covering the entire subject is now in the process of publication and should appear early in the new year. For your immediate information I am enclosing a list of publications to date covering the work done here on lead, and if there are any in which you feel the manufacturer to whom you refer would be especially interested, I shall be glad to send reprints. I am enclosing one reprint -- the paper read before the American Medical Association last June by Aub and his associates -- which gives a brief resumé of the subject and which may help the manufacturer to decide which of the more technical articles would be most helpful to him.

If I have not given you sufficient information I am sure that Dr. Drinker will be very glad to supply any of the missing links he can.
