Other studies have shown that where proper protective measures are taken, occupational health risks are minimized.

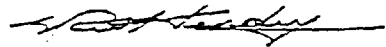

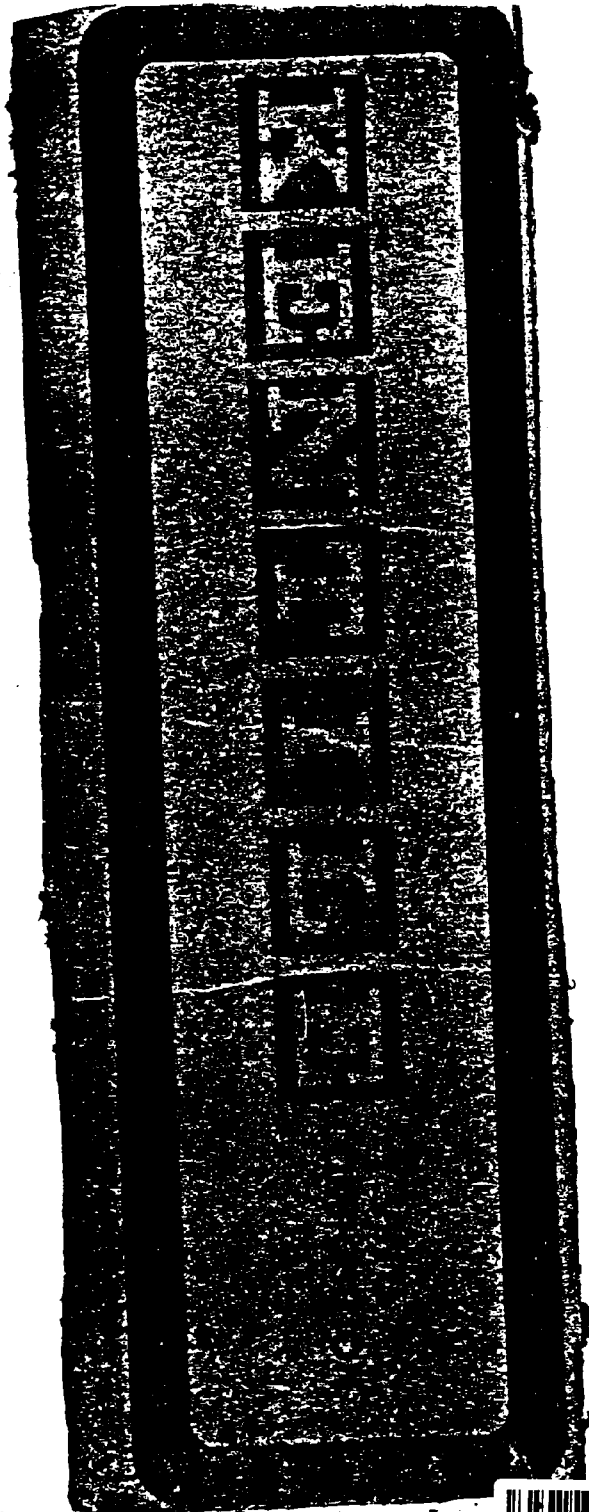
