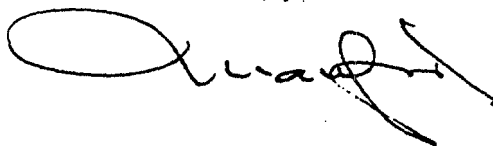
Dear Bob:
