Trailer Park Law Adoption Near

Adoption of a comprehensive county trailer park ordinance is expected at the Oct. 3 meeting of the County Planning Commission. The ordinance, which has been more than a year in preparation, received informal approval this week. Commissioners asked Julio Juarez, chief of the Southern Division of the County Health Department's Bureau of Sanitation, to combine the building and health permits into one Trailer Park Permit as a final step to adoption. A trailer park zoning district has been added to the 18 major zoning classifications in the county. The trailer parks will be placed as transition developments between business and multiple residential zones. Commissioners held 12 meetings and took three field trips to view existing trailer parks in the course of preparing the new ordinance.



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BERKELEY, Sept. 24—America's ability to produce food in large quantities at low costs can be attributed to the use of chemicals in agriculture. This is the opinion of Dr. Daniel G. Aldrich Jr., University of California dean of agriculture on the Berkeley campus. Speaking at a meeting of the Governor's Special Committee on Public Policy Regarding Agricultural Chemicals in Los Angeles, Dr. Aldrich said that American farmers must use chemical pesticides against insect enemies to insure an abundant and inexpensive supply of high quality nutritious foods. "Without these pesticides, we would not have our present supply of many foods, and those that would be available would cost much more," Dr. Aldrich declared. Dr. Aldrich urged agriculture to take steps to "play 'undecided or exaggerated stories' concerning chemicals poisoning food." "It is our duty to show the public that the use of chemicals in food production, preservation, and storage is carefully regulated by laws that are strictly enforced by governmental agencies and that farmers recognize a moral responsibility to use properly these chemicals," he said.
