Dear Dr. Nehoe:-

This will acknowledge receipt of your letter of the 1st and the final report on the observations you and your associates have made on our plant. I have read the report with interest and have turned it over to Mr. Pasig and my other associates here for their information.

We have experienced some little difficulty in securing what we consider to be a satisfactory dust collecting installation. We have not the best service from Link & Mum Manufacturing Company of your city, and as soon as these people finish one or two more tests we expect, if the tests work out satisfactorily, to place an order with them for the necessary equipment.

We believe the installation will be quite successful and should remove almost completely the hazards in our Mixing Department. We agree with you that the best solution for the hazards in the Receiving Department when shipments of pigment are being unloaded will be to have the men wear respirators. Mr. Clark has succeeded in locating a respirator that has less objectionable features than any we have found in the past and for that reason our men are offering little objection to its use.

We enclose a check in payment of the bill that you sent and can assure you that we are quite happy over the results of your investigation, and not the least of the reasons is the opportunity that all of us have enjoyed of becoming better acquainted with you and your associate, Dr. Ashe.
