Since Mr. [REDACTED] states that he has had no medical attention since 1935, when he was admitted as a patient in the clinic of St. Joseph's Hospital, Hot Springs, Arkansas, we are writing you in the hope that you may have knowledge of some recently discovered method of treating this particular condition.

Although Mr. [REDACTED] is not one of our clients, due to the fact that there is no provision of our Welfare Act which would enable us to deal with cases of this nature, we nevertheless have taken an interest in this case. Any suggestions you may offer will be deeply appreciated by Mr. [REDACTED].
