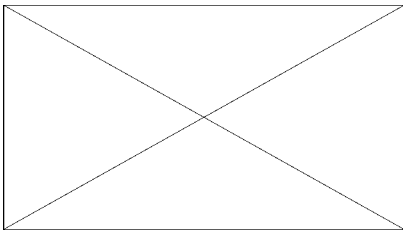

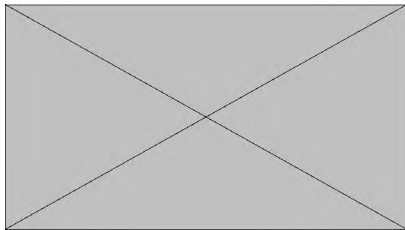
Hi Allison,


Hi Aurelia,
