**ASBESTOS WORKER'S
DEATH.**

Yesterday the County Coroner (Mr. E. N. Molesworth) opened an inquest at his offices, 11 Drake Street, Rochdale, relative to the death of Miss Marion Trevor, aged 31 years, of 3 Grouse Street, Rochdale.

The only evidence taken was that given by Mrs. Jane Trevor, who said the deceased, her daughter, was an asbestos worker. She was single and lived at 3 Grouse Street with wideness. The death occurred on Thursday after a long illness.

Mr. Molesworth adjourned the inquest until March 22nd, when he will hear medical testimony.

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
