Dear Mr. Cranston:

I send you herewith the results obtained by the application of the Dithizone method on samples which you recently supplied us for check analyses. These results can be accepted as having a very high degree of accuracy on the samples as supplied, the only opportunities for significant error residing in the possibility of contamination of the samples in transit or otherwise, and the possible loss of material through leakage. (One of the samples had leaked very slightly, but it seems unlikely that any appreciable error resulted since there was very little sediment.)

You will note that one of the samples checked almost precisely, one gave higher results in your hands than in ours while the other two gave lower results in your hands.

I trust these results will be of some assistance to you.
