Dear Dr. Lanza:

As I told you in Toronto, the Medical Division of the Bureau of Mines has been abolished. Therefore, in accordance with previous conversations, the cooperative work with the Bureau of Mines will be carried on under the direction of the Office of Industrial Hygiene and Sanitation of the Public Health Service. If you remember, we discussed this also with Mr. Knight and it was agreeable to him. The pay vouchers will be made out as in the past and will be signed by myself.

The group will probably be transferred to Washington some time the latter part of this month or the first part of next. After the 15th of this month Dr. Miller, Mr. Frooke and Mr. Whitmore will be the only ones remaining on the Metropolitan payroll in this laboratory.
