3 Received congratulations from the chamber of commerce for settling a fight with Burlingame over division of the Mills estate.

4 Instructed City Engineer Earl B. Wiley to proceed with plans to coordinate privately owned water systems now being purchased by the city.

5 Sent a letter of congratulation to San Bruno on completion of its new city hall.

Burlingame Starts Outfall Sewer Line

Work had started today on the laying of a new outfall sewer line that will increase the capacity of Burlingame's sewage system to provide for increased population in the city, George J. Marr, city engineer, announced.

First work on the \$110,000 project, being jointly financed by the city and the state, will be the filling of a causeway across tidelands to the city disposal plant at the eastern end of Broadway.

Subcontractor on the job is the Lowrie Paving company, while the laying of new outfall sewer lines along city streets will be done by the E. T. Haas company of Belmont, Marr reported.
