Automatic Fire Alarm System Goes on Rampage

Igniting the embarrassment of the Sea Frigate Packing Corporation, the automatic fire alarm system got stuck today and kept the Monterey fire department siren sounding off for five minutes or longer while every fireman on and off duty and every piece of apparatus plus a coast guard fire fighting contingent swarmed to cannery row prepared to battle the blaze of their lives.

It all happened when a workman cleaning things up at the plant with a live steam hose inadvertently turned the steam too near the gadget that sounds the fire department siren when it reaches a certain temperature. Up to that point it wasn't so bad, but for reasons known only to the mind of an electrician, the turning-off device didn't work.

Meanwhile, the siren at the fire house had begun, with which as the blowing siren built momentum working up to a fever up a crescendo of alarm. The device was finally shut off at the fire house end and the situation in general brought under control. Maddest of all were the off-duty firemen who were deep in slumber when the incident happened.

PEDESTRIAN SERIOUSLY INJURED IN ACCIDENT
