

TAXES ARE PAYABLE FOR THE FISCAL YEAR 1956-1957

For the information of Santa Clara County Taxpayers, the following are important details concerning taxes for the current year.

THE FIRST INSTALLMENT

of taxes, which includes one-half of the total tax on all Personal Property assessed by Real Estate, and one-half of the total tax on all Real Property, becomes due on November 1, 1956, and is due again on November 10, 1956, after which time a further penalty of 6% is added.

THE SECOND INSTALLMENT

comprising of the remaining one-half of the tax on all Personal Property assessed by Real Estate, and one-half of the total tax on all Real Property, is due on February 1, 1957, and becomes delinquent on April 10, 1957, after which time a further penalty of 6% is added to all unpaid taxes.

BOTH INSTALLMENTS

of taxes may be paid in one installment with the first installment, if desired.

ALL TAXES MAY BE PAID

At Any Time After Receiving Your Tax Bill on
Nov. 1, 1956

The Tax Collector's Office in the Hall of Justice, corner of Market & St. James Streets, San Jose, is open for your convenience every day between 8:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m., Saturdays, Sundays and legal holidays excepted.

TAXES MAY BE PAID BY MAIL

Checks, accepted for EXACT AMOUNT OF TAX BILL ONLY. Be sure to bring your TAX BILL with you, or enclose it with your remittance by mail.

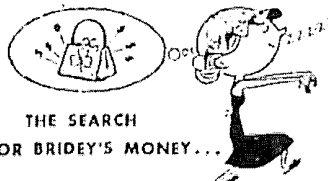

Miss Margaret is leader and Mrs. Hughes is co-leader of Girl Scout Troop 311. They plan to make this an interesting and constructive year of badge work.



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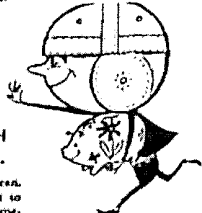
