Gentlemen:

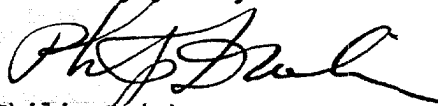
All of you know the general plans for an amalgamation of the Journal of Industrial Hygiene and Occupational Medicine. This will take place in actuality with the July, 1949 issue of this Journal. On that date, the American Medical Association becomes our publisher and continues the 1949 Volume to completion.
