I have just received a letter from Mrs. Grace M. Burnham, Director of the Workers' Health Bureau, New York City, from which I am led to infer that she is not going to forward you a copy of the criticisms drafted by the Bureau on the recent report from the Bureau of Mines on exhaust gases from engines using gasoline. I consider there is some value in the criticisms and have had it copied and enclose same herewith. The criticism appears to me to cover about everything imaginable. In the meantime I have advised Mrs. Burnham as one of the Advisory Committee of the Workers' Health Bureau to stay out of the controversy which is directly one between scientists and research workers at this stage. I have also assured her that there is no emergency apparent and that it is quite unwise for the Bureau which she directs to take a position antagonistic to state and government health officials.

I am sending another copy of the criticism to Supt. A. C. Fieldner.
