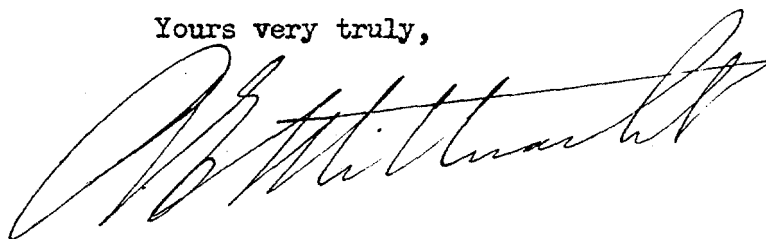

Dear Sir:

We have under observation at the present time a young man who has been employed as a helper at a filling station. He has been washing his hands with Ethyl gas to remove grease and eating his dinner while on the job.

It would appear from all indications, blood studies, etc that this patient is suffering from a severe chronic lead poisoning. Therefore, the following information is desired:

Have other cases been reported in the literature from the commercial handling of ethyl gas. In what form does lead exist in the ethyl gas. Is the lead volatile? This information is desired purely for scientific purposes as we are of the opinion that probably other unrecognized cases are occurring.
