

Woffington Out Of School

San Jose State's "Golden Raiders" went through their first practice session of the current spring training grind last night, but the Spartans were without the services of John Woffington and Freddy Lindsey. Woffington, in a surprise move, withdrew from school yesterday morning. Lindsey did not see action because of a painful hip sprain, but is expected to be back in uniform within a week. The loss of John Woffington hit the Winkelman-Warner combination hard. He was expected to take the place of Bud Green. In spring sessions he was running at the fullback slot. It was only temporary. Woffington's withdrawal leaves the

Spartans without the services of an experienced right half.
FIRST SESSION.

Taking to the arcs, the Spartan gridders ran plays, called signals, and then wound up the evening's festivities by going through a gruelling hour scrimmage. This afternoon, the State gridders will go back to sunshine drills, but tomorrow they take to the arcs lights again. From now on, night practices will be in order on Mondays and Wednesdays.

With 14 men having draft numbers, the San Jose coaching staff may be forced to dig deep into their bag of tricks for the 1941 season. If Uncle Sam puts the pressure on and makes the Spartans cry "uncle," he will take eight men out of their starting lineup.

To date, the best performances turned in have been shown by Lindsey, Vernon Cartwright and Hans Wiedenhofer. Cartwright started the season as a guard but Coach Winkelman shifted

him over to the inside tackle slot. Wiedenhofer is a watch-dog guard who will bear plenty of watching, and according to Winkelman, is a potential first stringer, as is Cartwright.

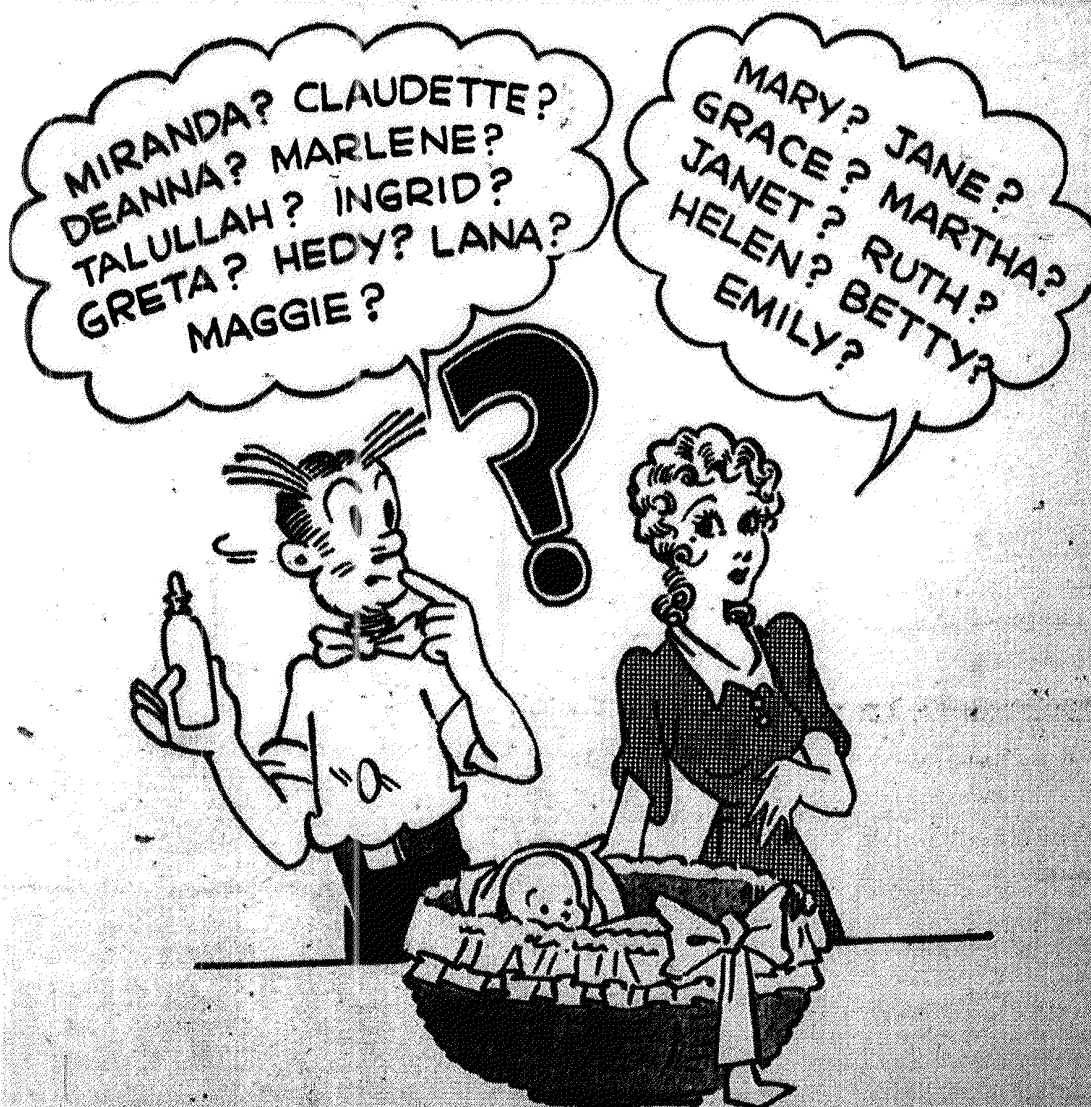
Greenberg has been playing with a team called the Detroit Tigers, in the American league, but is leaving the Detroit club May 7 to become a member of the United States army.

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
