During the arbitration of Grievance No. 1955, the Union's attorney, Mr. Bensik, asked for an identification of "toxic" chemicals present in the Petro-Tex' work environment, as discussed in certain meetings between Petro-Tex and the Unions in 1976 and 1977.

During these meetings, the Unions were given copies of standards or tentative standards as issued by various governmental publications for the following materials:

Vinyl Chloride Monomer
Trichloroethylene
Benzene
Ammonia
Sulphuric Acid
Toluene
Furfural
Xylene
MIBK

The Unions were also repeatedly advised that the first two, Vinyl Chloride Monomer and Trichloroethylene, were materials not used at Petro-Tex.

I trust this information will supply Mr. Bensik's needs. -
