- Industrial locomotives and other vehicles
- Lower parts of cranes and hoists
- Markings for protection, direction, and other purposes
- Material handling equipment
- Piers, ports, and columns which might be struck
- Waste containers for explosive or highly combustible materials
- Piping systems containing dangerous materials
