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Microwave Information for Employees

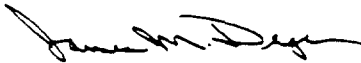
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Asbestos Information Package

Material Safety Data Sheets - Redbook Update

The State of California has enacted a new regulation that requires all employers to provide employees with complete information on all toxic substances that may be used in the workplace. New York and Connecticut will have similar requirements in a short time. These new State regulations, as well as the Federal OSHA standards, access to exposure records make it imperative that the project to update the Redbook proceed on an expedited basis. Progress will be reported at the next meeting.
