H.R. 134 Smog Control. To authorize and direct the Civil Aeronautics Board to study the need for smog control in the vicinity of airports in order to promote safety in air navigation. By Mr. King. To Interstate and Foreign Commerce Jan. 3.

New Bills

DELAWARE S.216 Water Pollution. To create a Department of Agriculture and Conservation and to assign functions thereto; to abolish the water pollution commission of the State of Delaware. To Revised Statutes March 7.

ILLINOIS H.269 Pollution of Water. Gives the department of public health power to prescribe rules to prevent pollution of fresh water supplies by oil, gas or salt water emanating from any oil or gas well. To Executive March 1.

MINNESOTA H.1203 Water Pollution. Amends Minn. Statutes 1949, Section 616.15 by adding a new subdivision to provide that every person who shall deposit, leave or cast into any lake, creek, or river wholly or partly within this state, or upon the ice thereof, any refuse, bottles, metal cans, abandoned fish houses or other debris shall be guilty of a misdemeanor. To Public Domain March 7.

PENNSYLVANIA S.116 Medical Research. Appropriating the sum of One Hundred and Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$150,000) for the two fiscal years beginning June first one thousand nine hundred and fifty-one to The Jefferson Medical College Philadelphia Pennsylvania for the further maintenance and support of a Research Institute of Preventive and Industrial Medicine. To Appropriations Feb. 12.

TEXAS H.504 Pollution. Amending Section 5 of Acts of 1943 regular session 48th legislature Page 413 Chapter 285 as amended by coordinating the duties and functions of the State Agencies named in the act relative to pollution. To State Affairs March 6.

UTAH S.227 Occupational Disease. Providing for the appointment of a medical panel with reference to total permanent disability and death cases arising from occupational disease.

WISCONSIN SR.12 Stream Pollution. Requesting an opinion from the attorney-general as to the validity and effect of the amendment thereto proposed by S.268, "Stream Pollution." Adopted March 1.

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TEXAS

H.504 Pollution. Amending Section 5 of Acts of 1943, Regular Session, 48th Legislature General and Special Laws, page 418, Chapter 285, as amended, creates the Texas Pollution Agencies named in the Act relative to pollution. To State Affairs March 8.

S.370 Water Pollution. Amending Section 5 (C) of Senate Bill 81, Chapter 178, 49th Legislature, regular session, 1945, so as to provide that no privy shall be constructed or maintained within one thousand twenty feet of any water well used for drinking. To State Affairs March 15.

VERMONT

H.312 Water Pollution. Authorizes water conservation board to assist municipalities in pollution abatement. Introduced March 16.
