RESULT OF INVESTIGATION: This is a continuation of the study performed by Gollob Analytical Service personnel at Amboy Terminaling on December 9, 1974.

During this segment of the investigation employees were monitored during non-routine operations deliberately simulating maximum possible peak exposure. All data are presented in the table.

RESULT OF INVESTIGATION:

On December 9, 1974, Messrs. L. Molinini and J. Traina of Gollob Analytical Service visited Amboy Terminaling and monitored two employees for eight hours to obtain a time weighted average for vinyl chloride exposure. In addition, gas samples were taken in special evacuated glass containers from several areas in the warehouse. The results of the warehouse sampling are reported separately under G.A.S. 32588 dated 12/9/74. All monitoring data are presented in the following table.
