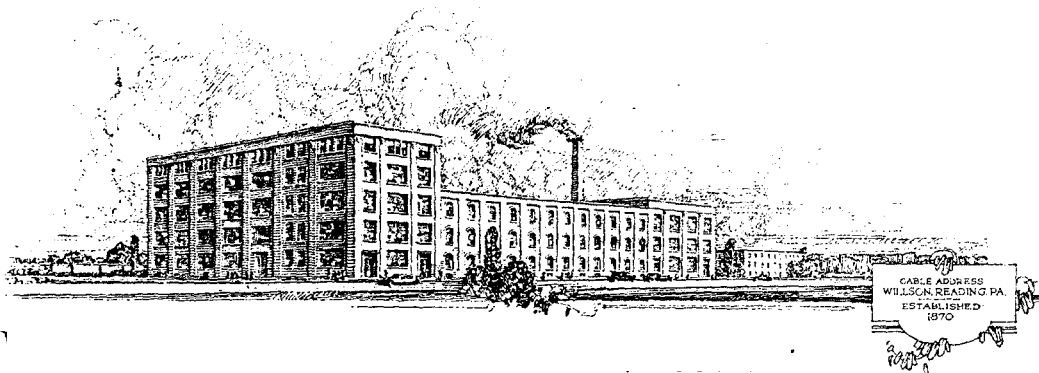

Gentlemen:

In reply to your letter of June 27th, we do not have any chemical cartridge respirator that we would recommend for use in a lead tetraethyl atmosphere. We do, however, for this condition recommend an Air Line Respirator, a picture of which is shown in the attached circular. These respirators will give the maximum protection while working in a lead atmosphere, and if the operator does not have to move around too much, they are proving very satisfactory.
