Renick H. Buckles, of 780 Ringwood Ave., Menlo Park, will help lead a forum discussion on "The Forecasting Side of Budgeting" before the San Francisco Chapter, National Association of Cost Accountants, on April 5.

Sondgroth Bros., Mountain View paving and grading firm, has instigated a series of safety meetings for its 90 employees. An insurance representative addressed the group at its first meeting this week and praised them for their safety record.

Insurance coverage was generally expanded for Menlo Park Elementary School District Wednesday night, but officials do not expect the changes to raise the insurance costs more than \$50 this year.

Acting on the advice of Insuranceceman Joseph Roberts, the trustees voted unanimously to:

1. Place the fire insurance coverage on a slightly more expensive "replacement cost" basis.
2. Drop Central School and auditorium from the blanket fire coverage and take out separate, less expensive policies providing a total \$36,000 coverage in case of fire.
3. Take out an "all-risk" policy for coverage of building contents.

German student finds U.S. not as reported

Ulrich Mohrman, German youth attending Mountain View Union High School, will return to his native land this summer and tell his countrymen the United States is not, after all, predominantly a land of "terrible traffic, Hollywood divorces and very wealthy people."

The exchange student, guest speaker at a meeting of the Los Altos Kiwanis Club, said that had been his impression of this country—gained from European newspapers—before he came to the United States. He said he now considers Americans to be basically much like people in his own land.

Fire Warden Ernest Wender announced that permits must be obtained during this period for all outdoor burning in the county's unincorporated areas.

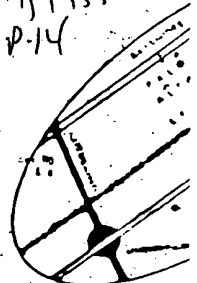
