That would be much more apt to occur in humans than in G. pigs, etc. Apparently you are quite sure of your position but unfortunately the responsibility in the situation would fall on me. However, the next time Mr. Beach is in I will go over the situation with him and if he is willing to take the chance I will be very glad to have him return to his previous methods in his occupation and get the specimens for you. You might send the containers to me now so

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that I will have them on hand.
