## AN ACT

Requiring employers employing one hundred or more persons in any shop or factory to employ one or more licensed physicians and one or more registered nurses to render medical aid requiring that medical and first aid equipment be made available by such employers providing penalties.

The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows

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- 1 Section 1 Every employer employing one hundred (100) or more
- 2 persons in any shop or factory shall
- 3 (a) Employ or engage one or more licensed physicians who shall be
- 4 present to render medical assistance at all necessary times at the place
- 5 where work is in progress Provided That if the number of persons
- 6 Employed is less than one thousand (1000) the physician shall be
- 7 deemed to be present if he is immediately available
- 8 Section 2 Every employer employing one hundred (100) or more
- 9 persons in any shop or factory shall
- 10 (a) Employ one or more registered nurses who shall be present at
- 11 the place where work is in progress and
- 12 (b) Make available such medical and first aid equipment as the
- 13 Department of Labor and Industry may require
- 14 Section 3 Such physician and registered nurse shall be available to
- 15 treat and administer Medical aid to persons employed who require
- 16 such aid during their hours of employment whether their need for
- 17 aid arises from industrial accident or otherwise
- 18 Section 4 Every employer violating the provisions of this act shall
- 19 upon conviction thereof in a summary proceeding be sentenced to pay a
- 1 fine not exceeding fifty dollars (\$50) or to be imprisoned not exceeding
- 2 thirty (30) days or both

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
