Dear Doctor Rouse:

I am sending you herewith the results of the analysis of the urine and blood of [REDACTED] together with an interpretation of the results.

In commenting on the attached report and its recorded interpretation, I believe it may be of interest to you to call attention specifically to the "low normal" concentration of lead in the urine. This is no surprise to me, and it will not surprise you, but it is of some consequence to recognize that, following the absorption of significant quantities of tetraethyl lead from any source, or over any length of time, the concentration of lead in the blood undergoes little or no change, while the urinary lead concentration goes to high levels which vary with the severity of the exposure. This result, therefore is doubly significant.
