Gentlemen:

C On February 21, 1975, this division conducted a general occupational health survey of the chemical and friction products plant. Consequently, we returned on March 18, and May 15, 1975 to conduct air contaminant studies. The survey and studies were conducted in your presence. We were accompanied variously by Chrysler corporate industrial hygienists W. Glazier, L. Gendornolik and L. Redmond, and also by union representatives M. Clayton and G. Pickrell.

P During our studies, air was sampled in the breathing zones of several employees for various air contaminants:

- asbestos and zinc oxide in the friction products plant and,
- vinyl chloride and solvent vapors in the chemical plant.

Y Locations and results are reported on the attached data sheets. The studies show that the air contaminant levels were within the existing State standards.

In most instances satisfactory control measures were provided. However, in some areas improvement is recommended. Emphasis should be placed on elimination of dry sweeping of asbestos containing debris in the friction products department. Vacuum cleaning or wet cleaning are recommended.

During clean up of the spill of zinc oxide, air concentrations were high. However, on a time weighted average the standard was not exceeded. We observed that respirators were worn during clean-up operations. Respirator use should be made mandatory on this or similar clean-up operations.
