As Dr. Machle has told you in his letter of August 14, the paper which I presented at the Pittsburg meeting of the A.A.I.P.S. last May has not been published as yet, and there is a considerable amount of work to be done on it before it can be published. Accordingly, I can not send you a copy of it. As a matter of fact, the information in this paper has very little direct bearing upon the [REDACTED] case, since most of our work in this article is concerned with ingested lead rather than inhaled lead. On the other hand, some of the general information may be worth discussion in connection with that case, and obviously, if I am to assist you, as I expect to do, I should be glad to acquaint you with the results of our work up to the time of the hearing, which will be far beyond the information presented in Pittsburg. Nevertheless, I should be glad to send you a copy of the paper when it has been published and is available for distribution.
