He stated that he has had a small amount of ankle edema on several occasions during the past month. He stated that he is taking a digitalis preparation, ten drops of a liquid medicine three times a day to loosen his sputum, and several tablets a day for his hypertension. He admitted that he had had hypertension for a long time. He has palpitation only after exertion. He has had an occasional dull ache in the right lower chest laterally.

After he left the Santa Maria Hospital he saw his personal doctor who sent him to the Maywood Hospital for a period of about eight days. During this time he was told that he had had a lung collapse. A thoracotomy was performed and mild suction drainage was instituted to re-expand his lung. He stated that the drainage tube was kept in place only a few days after which his lung re-expanded. While he was on negative suction he had considerable pain in his chest.

#### System History:

**Eyes, Ears, Nose and Throat:** He stated that he had had chest colds very infrequently in the past but that he had had an occasional head cold which was not disabling.

**Gastro-Intestinal:** He stated that his appetite was good. He denied any significant symptoms relative to this system.

**Genito-Urinary:** He has nocturia occasionally. Except for this he has not had any recent symptoms relative to this system.

**General:** His energy is fair. If he exerts himself he becomes dyspneic and weak. His tiredness is variable. This is not necessarily associated with any particular activity. He has had an occasional pain in his shoulders. If he sits for a time he develops a stiffness in his lower back. He perspires considerably. He has had a slight rash in the lower cervical area anteriorly for an indeterminate period of time.

**Habits:** Alcohol: He uses alcohol rarely. Tobacco: He has smoked a package of cigarettes a day for many years. Coffee: He drinks about two to three cups a day.

**Past Medical History:** He stated that he had asthma as a youth then for a period of about twenty years he was relatively free of it. For the past seven to eight years it has been present fairly continuously. He had an appendectomy in 1924. He had a knife cut on his right arm in 1925. He had surgery for a right kidney stone in 1945. He has had hypertension for a number of years. Recently he was told that he had heart trouble. On one occasion while working in Watsonville, California he suffered a heart attack.

He was not unconscious at the time but he stated that he had a headache for a considerable period of time. At this time he also had a cardiac study and was told that he had a heart block.

**Occupational History:** He stated that he has been doing insulation work for the greater part of about seventeen years. For a period of six years he was a marine engineer in which work he handled asbestos and fiber glass. He said that no masks were worn in this type of work. He worked for Coast Insulation Company for about seven years. During this period he did insulation work covering pipes and blocking towers on oil refineries. He stated that the material was cut with a power saw and at times it was very dusty work. No masks or respirators were worn. He also worked for the Plant Asbestos Company and for the Mundet Cork Company for a period of about six years off and on. From December 1960 to August 1961 he worked for Armstrong in Daggett, California, insulating boilers and about this time half time for the American Borax Company in Trona, California also doing an insulation job. Between August 1961 and January 1962 he was off of active work however he did a short job for Ferguson and Smith insulating at the Vandenberg Air Base. From January 24, 1962 to February 2, 1962 he worked for the Plant Insulation Company.

Physical examination revealed a ruddy faced, well developed, well nourished, adult white male who did not appear acutely or chronically ill. He was not dyspneic at rest.

Blood Pressure: 200/124; Temperature: 97.4; Pulse: 72, regular.

**Head and Neck:**

Eyes: reactions and movements normal.

Ears: right canal filled with wax, left normal.

Nose: tip of nose bluish in color (patient stated that this had been present for many years), mucosa normal, passages ample.

Dentition: upper and lower plates.

Pharynx: clear.

Tonsils: small, atrophic.

Neck: no adenopathy or abnormal pulsations.

Chest: symmetrical, slight retraction of the second right interspace with inspiration.

Lungs: breath sounds diminished bilaterally, expiratory wheeze present in both lung fields, greater on the right than the left, coarse ronchi with cough in both lung fields.

Heart: regular rhythm, no murmurs.

Abdomen: right rectus scar and right lower quad. tenderness

The patient was referred to the x-ray department of the Hospital of the Good Samaritan for chest x-rays. These were interpreted as follows:

"Postero-anterior and lateral views of the chest show the lungs to be over-expanded and markedly emphysematous. In the 11th anterior interspace, on the right side, there is a sharply delineated, 8 X 10 mm. in diameter, oval density, which may represent nipple shadow, but this appears to correspond with a density adjacent to the anterior chest wall on the lateral projection. The left lung is clear. The nodular density on the right side would appear to be associated with the pleura. The transverse diameter of the heart measures 15.5 cm. as compared to the transthoracic diameter of 33 cm. The cardiac size and contour are normal. There is a scoliosis in the upper dorsal spine with the convexity to the left."

The question arises in this instance as to the possible relationship of this patient's advanced pulmonary emphysema. The patient alleges that his lung condition is the result of his being exposed to fiberglass and asbestos dust. However, a careful review of this patient's past medical history will reveal that he has had a known bronchial asthma since early childhood and this condition has become progressively worse in the recent seven to eight years. The presence of this condition alone is a most important factor in the development of his present pulmonary emphysema. One of the most important causes for the development of an advanced emphysema is the history of a long standing bronchial asthma where the factor of bronchospasm which is so important in the development of pulmonary emphysema has been present. In this instance we have a history of possibly forty years of intermittent episodes of bronchospasm as manifested by the chronic bronchial asthma. The presence of the bronchial asthma over this long period of time, alone, could produce his present pulmonary state. In addition he admitted the habit of cigarette smoking of about a package of cigarettes a day for many years. This latter habit would also be considered a significant factor in the development of his pulmonary emphysema.

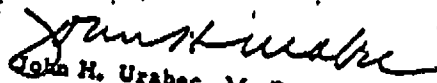
Lastly he admitted that he worked in insulation and had contact with asbestos and fiberglass, how much of the latter was not clearly determined. Nevertheless, it would appear that his asbestos exposure was minimal since he inhaled allegedly asbestos when he was cutting the insulation material. It appeared to me from the history that such a cutting process was but a minor part of his work. Furthermore, asbestosis, as manifested in the lung radiologically, was not seen on the films taken at this time. The findings were in keeping with those seen in smoking and as the result of a long standing bronchial asthma. In view of the above it is my opinion that his alleged asbestos exposure was not a significant factor in the development of his present

advanced pulmonary emphysema but that this condition was secondary to factors unrelated to his occupational environment.

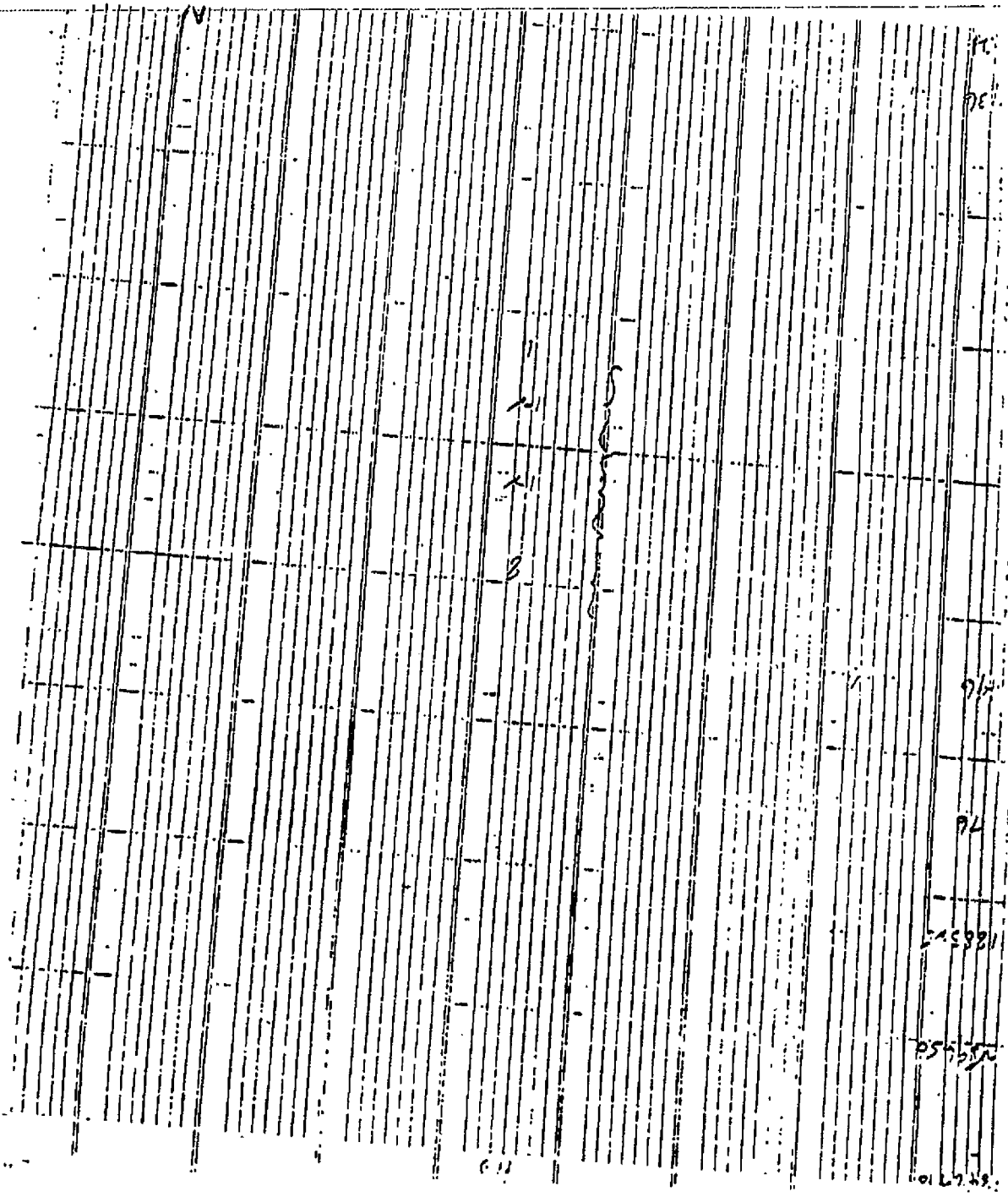
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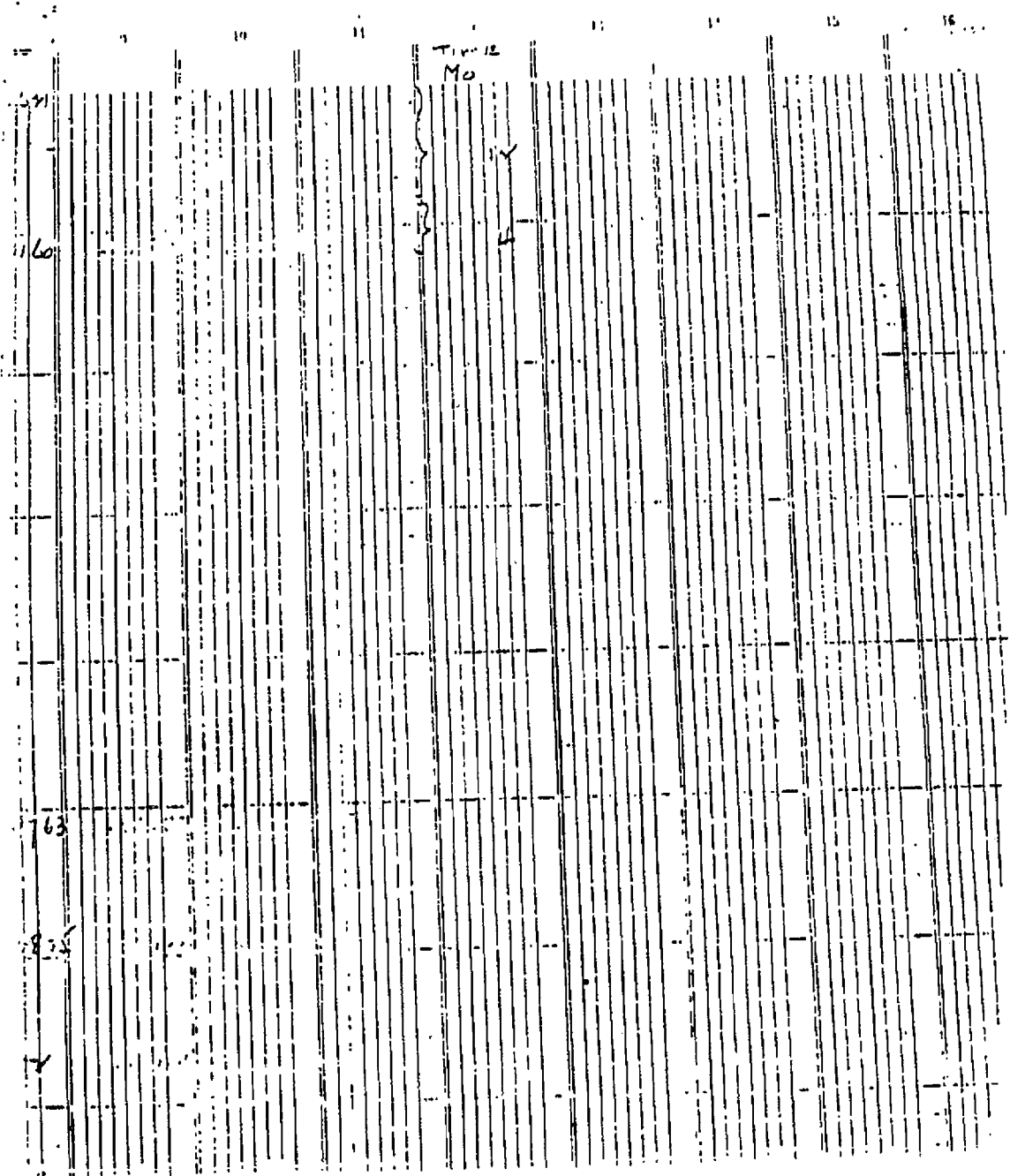

Allowing an unsuccessful applicant his litigation costs is discretionary with the Board, not jurisdictional. In this case it is our opinion that applicant should be allowed his medical-legal expenses incurred in this contested matter, to be adjusted between the parties if possible and if not, then to be determined at the Referee's level.

We accordingly make the following Findings of Fact:

On the other hand, Dr. Lee is a man who appears to be approximately 60 years of age and the undersigned was particularly impressed with the opinions expressed by him, for Dr. Lee in his testimony exhibited experience and competence, as well as a desire to be eminently fair and unbiased in the opinions which he expressed in this case. It is, of course, for these very reasons that appellate courts have consistently held that where there is a conflict in the evidence the trier of fact, who has the opportunity to observe and hear the witnesses, is the sole judge of the credibility of the witnesses.

As stated in the Opinion of Referee on Finding and Orders the reports and testimony of Dr. Lee support the finding that applicant did not sustain an injury arising out of and occurring in the course of his employment. In addition, even without the benefit of this evidence, it was my opinion that the evidence of record, prior to the reference of the case to Dr. Lee as an independent medical examiner, showed that applicant's claim of industrial injury was highly questionable. However, in order to be sure that applicant's case was fully and carefully investigated it was decided to refer the case to an independent medical examiner. It is, therefore, submitted that the record clearly establishes applicant's case has been fully and carefully investigated and that despite the arguments to the contrary he was given every opportunity to prove his case.

Petitioner also argues that he should have been referred to an independent medical examiner for a biopsy of his lung. As far as the undersigned is concerned, irrespective of the assurances of petitioner's counsel to the contrary, such a procedure is sufficiently hazardous to petitioner that we do not wish to be a party to the same and the testimony of Dr. Lee that a biopsy is not without hazard to the patient fully supports this conclusion.

By Amendment to his petition, which was subsequently filed, petitioner raises the point that he should be entitled to receive reimbursement for medical-legal costs even if no injury was found. The decision of former Panel Two of the Industrial Accident Commission in the case of Carl E. Van Loon v. Hartford Indemnity Company, 61 LA 222-209 holds to the contrary.

Petitioner also argues that because Dr. Lee in his report, dated October 26, 1963, at page 3 (Commission's Exhibit 5) states, "Although some episodes of respiratory complaints followed exposure to dusts of asbestos or fiberglass, these were of temporary nature, with duration of a few hours and no restrictive work ability the following morning" that "from a technic standpoint even on Dr. Lee's conclusions, your applicant sustained an injury. It is believed, first, that to so argue is completely unrealistic and indeed "grasping at straws" and, also secondly, that the legal maxim stated in Civil Code Section 3533, "The law disregards trifles." fully answers such a claim.

In conclusion it is submitted a review of the medical evidence shows that applicant has a number of physical problems, which is not particularly unusual for a man, born November 3, 1899. However, it is further submitted that the substantial medical evidence shows that what is wrong with him physically is not due to his employment.

RECOMMENDATION:

Petition for Reconsideration be denied.

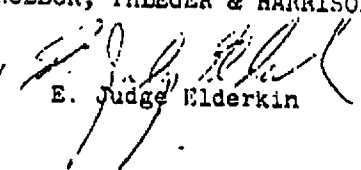

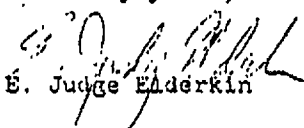

OPINION OF REFEREE ON FINDING AND ORDER

In the application filed herein applicant, born November 3, 1899, alleges that while employed on "1/24 - 2/2/62" as an asbestos worker, at maximum earnings, he sustained an injury arising out of and occurring in the course of his employment as follows: "inhalation of asbestos materials resulting in lung condition-occupational disease." The application only named as defendants "Plant Asbestos" and "Employers Group."

Thereafter on motion of Employers Liability Assurance Corporation, a corporation, additional employers and insurance carriers were ordered joined as defendants. Following these joinders, as the Minutes of Hearing for February 1, 1963, reflect, "APPLICANT ELECTED to proceed against Plant Asbestos Company, a corporation, and its two insurance carriers, Industrial Indemnity Company, a corporation, and American Employers Insurance Company, a corporation."

At the hearing on May 22, 1963, stipulations and sixteen issues were framed as set forth in the Minutes of Hearing and Report of Referee for this date.

The basic issue is whether applicant sustained an injury arising out of and occurring in the course of employment. In my opinion the substantial evidence establishes he did not. In support thereof reference is made to the reports of the independent medical examiner, H. I. Lee, M.D., dated October 26, 1963 (Commission's Exhibit 5) and October 12, 1964 (Commission's Exhibit 6) and his testimony given at the hearings on May 6, 1964, and November 24, 1965. Accordingly, based thereon, it will be found applicant did not sustain an injury arising out of and occurring in the course of his employment and it will be ordered that applicant take nothing from defendants.

Gentlemen:

Mr. Arthur H. Miller came to my office on September 27, 1962 for an examination and an evaluation of his present pulmonary condition. At the time of his visit the following medical history and physical examination were obtained.

Age: 62; Occupation: Insulation work; Marital Status: Married;  
Birthplace: Boston, Massachusetts, November 8, 1899; In California since 1935.

Family History: Father: Deceased at the age of 87, cause unknown; Mother: Deceased at the age of 87, cause unknown; Brothers: Two, one full brother and one half brother, living and well; Sisters: Two, one deceased and one living and well; Children: Three, two grown and living and well and a son aged three deceased.

Present Illness: The patient stated that he felt fairly well until January 1961 when he was hospitalized at a Santa Maria Hospital because he was told that he had asbestosis and congestive heart failure. He stated that previous to this hospitalization he would become short of breath on occasions but this was not of any significant severity. While he was working at the Vandenberg Air Base he noticed increasing shortness of breath. On one occasion he had an episode of moderately severe dyspnea. Because of this he consulted a physician, Dr. Campbell who put him in the hospital in Santa Maria. He admitted that previous to this occasion he had been taking Tedral tablets, a bronchodilator drug usually used for shortness of breath, under the supervision of Dr. Swartz in Los Angeles. He stated that he had consulted Dr. Swartz off and on for the past ten years, occasionally for shortness of breath and kidney stones. He stated that he saw this physician at intervals of about two to six months and during the recent years with increasing frequency. He stated that he saw Dr. Swartz about one month before he went to Vandenberg. He stated that he has a cough which has been of varying severity and frequency. He raises a small amount of white frothy sputum on occasions. He has not had any hemoptysis. He denied any orthopnea or nocturnal dyspnea. He stated that on several occasions he had a choking sensation at night at which time he would force himself to cough. After this he was again able to lie down and go to sleep.

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He stated that he has had a small amount of ankle edema on several occasions during the past month. He stated that he is taking a digitalis preparation, ten drops of a liquid medicine three times a day to loosen his sputum, and several tablets a day for his hypertension. He admitted that he had had hypertension for a long time. He has palpitation only after exertion. He has had an occasional dull ache in the right lower chest laterally.

After he left the Santa Maria Hospital he saw his personal doctor who sent him to the Maywood Hospital for a period of about eight days. During this time he was told that he had had a lung collapse. A thoracotomy was performed and mild suction drainage was instituted to re-expand his lung. He stated that the drainage tube was kept in place only a few days after which his lung re-expanded. While he was on negative suction he had considerable pain in his chest.

**System History:**

**Eyes, Ears, Nose and Throat:** He stated that he had had chest colds very infrequently in the past but that he had had an occasional head cold which was not disabling.

**Gastro-Intestinal:** He stated that his appetite was good. He denied any significant symptoms relative to this system.

**Genito-Urinary:** He has nocturia occasionally. Except for this he has not had any recent symptoms relative to this system.

**General:** His energy is fair. If he exerts himself he becomes dyspneic and weak. His tiredness is variable. This is not necessarily associated with any particular activity. He has had an occasional pain in his shoulders. If he sits for a time he develops a stiffness in his lower back. He perspires considerably. He has had a slight rash in the lower cervical area anteriorly for an indeterminate period of time.

**Habits: Alcohol:** He uses alcohol rarely. **Tobacco:** He has smoked a package of cigarettes a day for many years. **Coffee:** He drinks about two to three cups a day.

**Past Medical History:** He stated that he had asthma as a youth then for a period of about twenty years he was relatively free of it. For the past seven to eight years it has been present fairly continuously. He had an appendectomy in 1924. He had a knife cut on his right arm in 1925. He had surgery for a right kidney stone in 1945. He has had hypertension for a number of years. Recently he was told that he had heart trouble. On one occasion while working in Watsonville, California he struck his head on an overhead beam.

CLL

He was not unconscious at the time but he stated that he had a headache for a considerable period of time. At this time he also had a cardiac study and was told that he had a heart block.

**Occupational History:** He stated that he has been doing insulation work for the greater part of about seventeen years. For a period of six years he was a marine engineer in which work he handled asbestos and fiber glass. He said that no masks were worn in this type of work. He worked for Coast Insulation Company for about seven years. During this period he did insulation work covering pipes and blocking towers on oil refineries. He stated that the material was cut with a power saw and at times it was very dusty work. No masks or respirators were worn. He also worked for the Plant Asbestos Company and for the Mundet Cork Company for a period of about six years off and on. From December 1960 to August 1961 he worked for Armstrong in Daggett, California, insulating boilers and about this time half time for the American Borax Company in Trona, California also doing an insulation job. Between August 1961 and January 1962 he was off of active work however he did a short job for Ferguson and Smith insulating at the Vandenberg Air Base. From January 24, 1962 to February 2, 1962 he worked for the Plant Insulation Company.

Physical examination revealed a ruddy faced, well developed, well nourished, adult white male who did not appear acutely or chronically ill. He was not dyspneic at rest.

Blood Pressure: 200/124; Temperature: 97.4; Pulse: 72, regular.

**Head and Neck:**

Eyes: reactions and movements normal.

Ears: right canal filled with wax, left normal.

Nose: tip of nose bluish in color (patient stated that this had been present for many years), mucosa normal, passages ample.

Dentition: upper and lower plates.

Pharynx: clear.

Tonsils: small, atrophic.

Neck: no adenopathy or abnormal pulsations.

Chest: symmetrical, slight retraction of the second right interspace with inspiration.

Lungs: breath sounds diminished bilaterally, expiratory wheeze present in both lung fields, greater on the right than the left, coarse ronchi with cough in both lung fields.

Heart: regular rhythm, no murmurs.

Abdomen: right rectus scar and right lower quadrant scar, no masses or tenderness.

Genitalia: normal.

Extremities: no edema or varices.

The patient was referred to the x-ray department of the Hospital of the Good Samaritan for chest x-rays. These were interpreted as follows:

"Postero-anterior and lateral views of the chest show the lungs to be over-expanded and markedly emphysematous. In the fifth anterior interspace, on the right side, there is a sharply delineated, 8 X 10 mm. in diameter, oval density, which may represent nipple shadow, but this appears to correspond with a density adjacent to the anterior chest wall on the lateral projection. The left lung is clear. The nodular density on the right side would appear to be associated with the pleura. The transverse diameter of the heart measures 15.5 cm. as compared to the transthoracic diameter of 33 cm. The cardiac size and contour are normal. There is a scoliosis in the upper dorsal spine with the convexity to the left."

The question arises in this instance as to the possible relationship of this patient's advanced pulmonary emphysema. The patient alleges that his lung condition is the result of his being exposed to fiberglass and asbestos dust. However, a careful review of this patient's past medical history will reveal that he has had a known bronchial asthma since early childhood and this condition has become progressively worse in the recent seven to eight years. The presence of this condition alone is a most important factor in the development of his present pulmonary emphysema. One of the most important causes for the development of an advanced emphysema is the history of a long standing bronchial asthma where the factor of bronchospasm which is so important in the development of pulmonary emphysema has been present. In this instance we have a history of possibly forty years of intermittent episodes of bronchospasm as manifested by the chronic bronchial asthma. The presence of the bronchial asthma over this long period of time, alone, could produce his present pulmonary state. In addition he admitted the habit of cigarette smoking of about a package of cigarettes a day for many years. This latter habit would also be considered a significant factor in the development of his pulmonary emphysema.

Lastly he admitted that he worked in insulation and had contact with asbestos and fiberglass, how much of the latter was not clearly determined. Nevertheless, it would appear that his asbestos exposure was minimal since he inhaled allegedly asbestos when he was cutting the insulation material. It appeared to me from the history that such a cutting process was but a minor part of his work. Furthermore, asbestosis, as manifested in the lung radiologically, was not seen on the films taken at this time. The findings were in keeping with those seen in smoking and as the result of a long standing bronchial asthma. In view of the above it is my opinion that his alleged asbestos exposure was not a significant factor in the development of his present

advanced pulmonary emphysema but that this condition was secondary to factors unrelated to his occupational environment.

In the above entitled matter we appeared on your behalf at the hearing held February 1, 1963 at Los Angeles before Referee Wilhelmina Benes. The applicant was apparently present but we did not observe him. He was represented by Mr. Steven Roseman.

After stipulations were taken as to workmen's compensation insurance coverage, Mr. Roseman stated that the applicant elected to proceed against Plant Asbestos Company and its carriers. The matter will thereafter be set for hearing and as we understand it, the remaining employers and their carriers are restricted to participation in proceeding to the extent of inquiring as to employment and exposure at the establishments of their principals. We understand that Mr. Roseman's price for settlement is \$20,000.

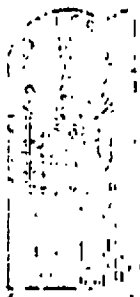

Gentlemen:

Mr. Arthur H. Miller came to my office on September 27, 1962 for an examination and an evaluation of his present pulmonary condition. At the time of his visit the following medical history and physical examination were obtained.

Age: 62; Occupation: Insulation work; Marital Status: Married;  
Birthplace: Boston, Massachusetts, November 8, 1899; In California since 1935.

Family History: Father: Deceased at the age of 87, cause unknown; Mother: Deceased at the age of 87, cause unknown; Brothers: Two, one full brother and one half brother, living and well; Sisters: Two, one deceased and one living and well; Children: Three, two grown and living and well and a son aged three deceased.

Present Illness: The patient stated that he felt fairly well until January 1961 when he was hospitalized at a Santa Maria Hospital because he was told that he had asbestosis and congestive heart failure. He stated that previous to this hospitalization he would become short of breath on occasions but this was not of any significant severity. While he was working at the Vandenberg Air Base he noticed increasing shortness of breath. On one occasion he had an episode of moderately severe dyspnea. Because of this he consulted a physician, Dr. Campbell who put him in the hospital in Santa Maria. He admitted that previous to this occasion he had been taking Tedral tablets, a bronchodilator drug usually used for shortness of breath, under the supervision of Dr. Swartz in Los Angeles. He stated that he had consulted Dr. Swartz off and on for the past ten years, occasionally for shortness of breath and kidney stones. He stated that he saw this physician at intervals of about two to six months and during the recent years with increasing frequency. He stated that he saw Dr. Swartz about one month before he went to Vandenberg. He stated that he has a cough which has been of varying severity and frequency. He raises a small amount of white frothy sputum on occasions. He has not had any hemoptysis. He denied any orthopnea or nocturnal dyspnea. He stated that on several occasions he had a choking sensation at night at which time he would force himself to cough. After this he was again able to lie down and go to sleep.

He stated that he has had a small amount of ankle edema on several occasions during the past month. He stated that he is taking a digitalis preparation, ten drops of a liquid medicine three times a day to loosen his sputum, and several tablets a day for his hypertension. He admitted that he had had hypertension for a long time. He has palpitation only after exertion. He has had an occasional dull ache in the right lower chest laterally.

After he left the Santa Maria Hospital he saw his personal doctor who sent him to the Maywood Hospital for a period of about eight days. During this time he was told that he had had a lung collapse. A thoracotomy was performed and mild suction drainage was instituted to re-expand his lung. He stated that the drainage tube was kept in place only a few days after which his lung re-expanded. While he was on negative suction he had considerable pain in his chest.

#### System History:

**Eyes, Ears, Nose and Throat:** He stated that he had had chest colds very infrequently in the past but that he had had an occasional head cold which was not disabling.

**Gastro-Intestinal:** He stated that his appetite was good. He denied any significant symptoms relative to this system.

**Genito-Urinary:** He has nocturia occasionally. Except for this he has not had any recent symptoms relative to this system.

**General:** His energy is fair. If he exerts himself he becomes dyspneic and weak. His tiredness is variable. This is not necessarily associated with any particular activity. He has had an occasional pain in his shoulders. If he sits for a time he develops a stiffness in his lower back. He perspires considerably. He has had a slight rash in the lower cervical area anteriorly for an indeterminate period of time.

**Habits:** Alcohol: He uses alcohol rarely. Tobacco: He has smoked a package of cigarettes a day for many years. Coffee: He drinks about two to three cups a day.

**Past Medical History:** He stated that he had asthma as a youth then for a period of about twenty years he was relatively free of it. For the past seven to eight years it has been present fairly continuously. He had an appendectomy in 1924. He had a knife cut on his right arm in 1925. He had surgery for a right kidney stone in 1945. He has had hypertension for a number of years. Recently he was told that he had heart trouble. On one occasion while working in Watsonville, California he struck his head on an overhead beam.

He was not unconscious at the time but he stated that he had a headache for a considerable period of time. At this time he also had a cardiac study and was told that he had a heart block.

**Occupational History:** He stated that he has been doing insulation work for the greater part of about seventeen years. For a period of six years he was a marine engineer in which work he handled asbestos and fiber glass. He said that no masks were worn in this type of work. He worked for Coast Insulation Company for about seven years. During this period he did insulation work covering pipes and blocking towers on oil refineries. He stated that the material was cut with a power saw and at times it was very dusty work. No masks or respirators were worn. He also worked for the Plant Asbestos Company and for the Mundet Cork Company for a period of about six years off and on. From December 1960 to August 1961 he worked for Armstrong in Daggett, California, insulating boilers and about this time half time for the American Borax Company in Trona, California also doing an insulation job. Between August 1961 and January 1962 he was off of active work however he did a short job for Ferguson and Smith insulating at the Vandenberg Air Base. From January 24, 1962 to February 2, 1962 he worked for the Plant Insulation Company.

Physical examination revealed a ruddy faced, well developed, well nourished, adult white male who did not appear acutely or chronically ill. He was not dyspneic at rest.

Blood Pressure: 200/124; Temperature: 97.4; Pulse: 72, regular.

**Head and Neck:**

Eyes: reactions and movements normal.  
Ears: right canal filled with wax, left normal.  
Nose: tip of nose bluish in color (patient stated that this had been present for many years), mucosa normal, passages ample.  
Dentition: upper and lower plates.  
Pharynx: clear.  
Tonsils: small, atrophic.  
Neck: no adenopathy or abnormal pulsations.  
Chest: symmetrical, slight retraction of the second right interspace with inspiration.  
Lungs: breath sounds diminished bilaterally, expiratory wheeze present in both lung fields, greater on the right than the left, coarse ronchi with cough in both lung fields.  
Heart: regular rhythm, no murmurs.  
Abdomen: right rectus scar and right lower quadrant scar, no masses or tenderness.  
Genitalia: normal.  
Extremities: no edema or varices.

The patient was referred to the x-ray department of the Hospital of the Good Samaritan for chest x-rays. These were interpreted as follows:

"Postero-anterior and lateral views of the chest show the lungs to be over-expanded and markedly emphysematous. In the fifth anterior interspace, on the right side, there is a sharply delineated, 8 X 10 mm. in diameter, oval density, which may represent nipple shadow, but this appears to correspond with a density adjacent to the anterior chest wall on the lateral projection. The left lung is clear. The nodular density on the right side would appear to be associated with the pleura. The transverse diameter of the heart measures 15.5 cm. as compared to the transthoracic diameter of 33 cm. The cardiac size and contour are normal. There is a scoliosis in the upper dorsal spine with the convexity to the left."

The question arises in this instance as to the possible relationship of this patient's advanced pulmonary emphysema. The patient alleges that his lung condition is the result of his being exposed to fiberglass and asbestos dust. However, a careful review of this patient's past medical history will reveal that he has had a known bronchial asthma since early childhood and this condition has become progressively worse in the recent seven to eight years. The presence of this condition alone is a most important factor in the development of his present pulmonary emphysema. One of the most important causes for the development of an advanced emphysema is the history of a long standing bronchial asthma where the factor of bronchospasm which is so important in the development of pulmonary emphysema has been present. In this instance we have a history of possibly forty years of intermittent episodes of bronchospasm as manifested by the chronic bronchial asthma. The presence of the bronchial asthma over this long period of time, alone, could produce his present pulmonary state. In addition he admitted the habit of cigarette smoking of about a package of cigarettes a day for many years. This latter habit would also be considered a significant factor in the development of his pulmonary emphysema.

Lastly he admitted that he worked in insulation and had contact with asbestos and fiberglass, how much of the latter was not clearly determined. Nevertheless, it would appear that his asbestos exposure was minimal since he inhaled allegedly asbestos when he was cutting the insulation material. It appeared to me from the history that such a cutting process was but a minor part of his work. Furthermore, asbestosis, as manifested in the lung radiologically, was not seen on the films taken at this time. The findings were in keeping with those seen in smoking and as the result of a long standing bronchial asthma. In view of the above it is my opinion that his alleged asbestos exposure was not a significant factor in the development of his present

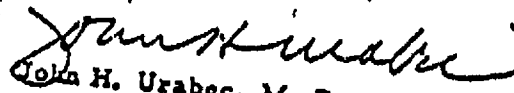

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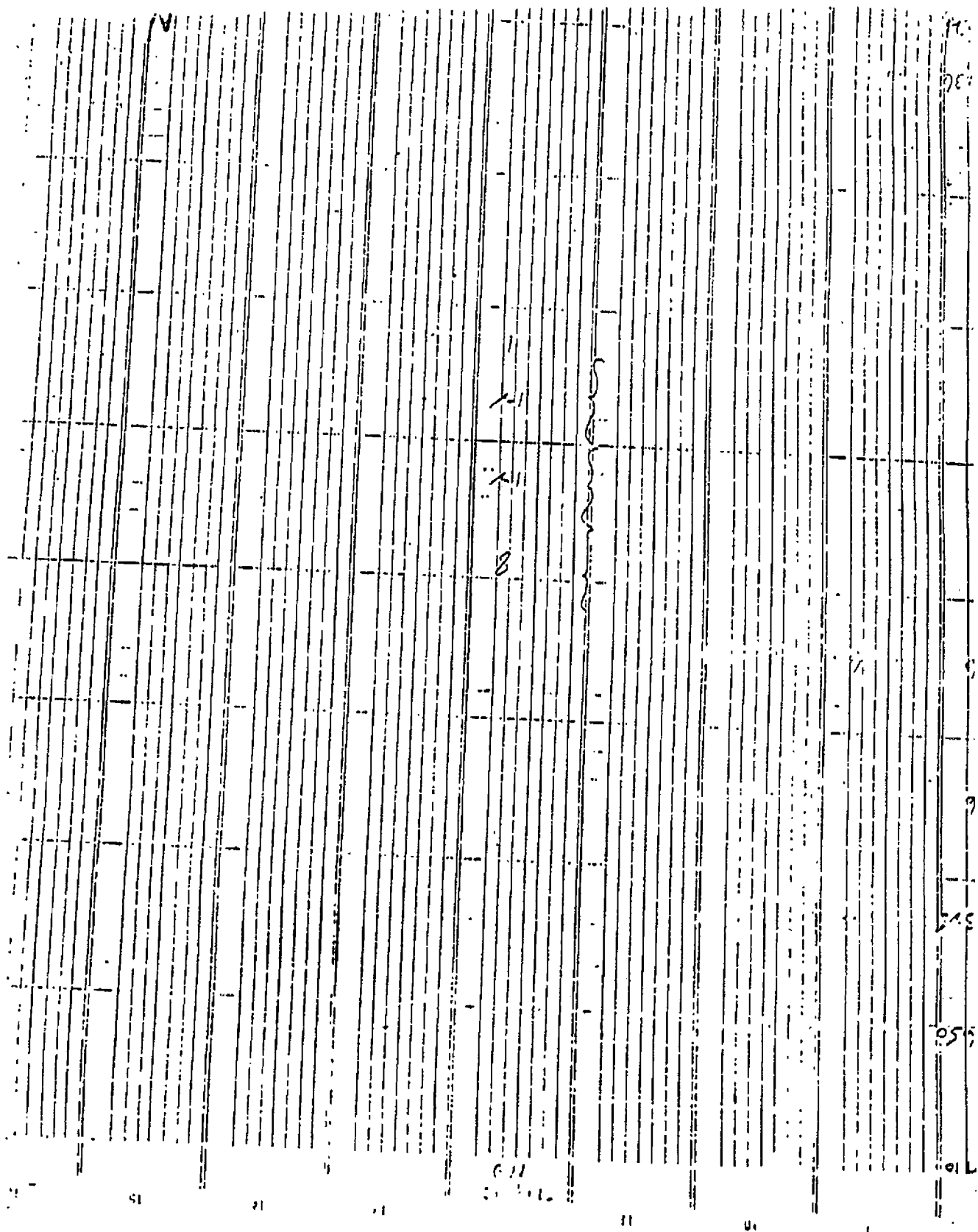
