Dear Sir:

Many of the health hazards associated with insulation work have only recently been defined and characterized. Therefore, much of the information is not widely known. This is unfortunate, since considerable progress is being made in developing appropriate controls to minimize or eliminate these hazards.

The Environmental Sciences Laboratory will conduct a postgraduate course reviewing knowledge in this field, intended primarily for physicians and other scientists concerned with the management, surveillance or protection of insulation workmen. It will be held at our institution June 15-18, 1970, and is described in the attached brochure.

The tuition for the course is \$400, but because of the importance of the matter, the Page and William Black Postgraduate School of Medicine will consider the granting of scholarships to physicians, industrial hygienists or others concerned with the care and protection of insulation workmen. We would be pleased to consider your nomination for such a scholarship, of a physician or hygienist concerned with the health or protection of men employed by your company.

Others may, of course, apply for participation in the course. We would be prepared to send the descriptive brochure, at your request.
