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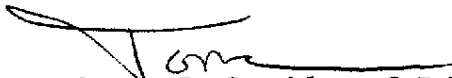

VISTA

1. Conducted an Industrial Hygiene Assessment at the Lake Charles Chemical Plant. The report is being drafted.
2. Met with the outside attorney assigned to the HF release lawsuits in Lake Charles. It is now known that Conoco was sued by the same parties for injuries resulting from a refinery release that day.
3. The Supreme Court refused to hear an appeal by Ethyl, Firestone, and Occidental that the VCM air emission standard is unenforceable. This arose out of lawsuits filed against these companies for relief valve discharges. Cases against several companies that were stayed pending the Supreme Court outcome will become active again. This will not effect us, since our three lawsuits are being settled out of court.
4. EPA Region VI provided us a draft letter for our review regarding their position on Reactor Opening Loss at OKC. We will discuss internally and get back to EPA.
5. Drafted new Material Safety Data Sheets for Heavy Aromatic Distillate, Acetylene and Acetone.
6. Advised Aberdeen on DOT requirements for shipping boxed compound dust.
7. Updated State Environmental Regulations for plants.
