We have just learned that members of the Lead Industries Association, doing business in Illinois, have been, or will probably be served with summonses in connection with an automobile accident experienced by our representative, Henry Clanson, since deceased, which occurred in 1934, near Chicago.

This case is known as Reference 37-8-1445, returnable to the Superior Court of Cook County, Fred M. Gay, a minor, by Fred W. Gay, his father and next friend, vs American Metal Co. Ltd. of Illinois, a corporation, et. al., naming all the companies in the sub-committee doing business as and members of the Lead Industries Association, a voluntary association, defendants.

We are covered by a \$50,000 and \$100,000 insurance policy in the Aetna Casualty and Surety Company, which is handling this case for us.
