OHIO STATE SHOOT

Vandalia—June 27

Singles Championship—Won by C. A. Bogert, Sandusky (CLIMAX shells) who broke 25 straight in shoot-off after triple tie at 198x200 which included H. W. Abell, Cleveland (DEFIANCE shells).

Doubles Championship—H. H. Smith, Troy (CLIMAX shells) tied for first with two others, 348x100 before shoot-off.

Class Championships—**CLASS A**—Won by C. A. Bogert (CLIMAX shells) with a string of 75 straight in shoot-off, which broke triple tie for first at 146x150.

CLASS B—D. W. Canley, Cleveland and Fred Koch, Brookville (both CLIMAX shells) tied for first at 140x150, before shoot-off, with one other shooter.

CLASS C—Won by Tom Thorpe, Tippecanoe City (DEFIANCE shells) with 140x150.

Handicap Championship—H. W. Abell (CLIMAX shells) tied for second place with 95x100 from 21 yards, winning in shoot-off with 25 straight.

All-Around Championship—Won by H. H. Smith (CLIMAX shells) with 369x400.

High-On-All-Targets—C. A. Bogert (CLIMAX shells) with 614x550. Long runs: 143 and 195.

Father-Son Team Race—Won by W. I. Spangler and son, the former shooting DEFIANCE shells.

Ladies' Championship—Won by Mrs. H. M. Hall, Harrisonville (CLIMAX shells) with 50x100.

Class Championship—Won by E. S. Stoler (CLIMAX shells) with 97x100. Second, Frank Wilmes, St. Louis (DEFIANCE shells), with 96x100.

Albany—May 14-16

Paul R. Earle, of Starr, South Carolina, was high in the doubles event with 127x150 shooting CLIMAX shells but was not eligible for the championship. He also won the High-Over-All with 623x750.

John I. Chipley, of Greenwood, South Carolina, broke 384x400 at 16-yard targets shooting CLIMAX shells, which gave him third place. Chipley also tied for high in the Handicap with 94x100 but was ineligible for the championship.



TRI-STATE SHOOT

(Arkansas-Mississippi-Tennessee)

Memphis—May 27-29

Bord F. Duncan, Lucy, Tenn., had the High General Average for the meet with 675x700, shooting DEFIANCE shells. He was also high on 500 16-yard targets with 489x500, won the Professional Class Championship with 198x200, placed second in the Professional Tri-State Championship with 195x200, and won the Professional Doubles Championship with 95x100.

The Handicap Championship was won by Julius Petty, England, Ark., who scored 98x100 from 20 yards, using mixed loads which included some DEFIANCE shells.

Frank M. Duncan, Lucy, Tenn., tied for second place in the Chase B Championship with 192x200 and won the shoot-off with 97x100, shooting DEFIANCE shells. He also tied for second in the Tri-State Singles Championship with 194x200 and placed fourth on 500 16-yard targets with 482x500.

High Average—300 16-yard Targets—Bord F. Duncan, Lucy, Tenn. (DEFIANCE shells) with 239x300.
