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GEO. O. CARPENTER PASSES AWAY

Geo. O. Carpenter, former vice-president and director of National Lead Company, passed away in the Barnes Hospital in St. Louis on Dec. 2. He was 87 years old.

Mr. Carpenter, who was a graduate of the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, began his career with the St. Louis Lead & Oil Co. in 1870 and was later its president. When that concern became a part of National Lead Company in 1891, he was elected a director of the latter Company and made manager of the St. Louis branch. He was elected a vice-president in 1908.

Mr. Carpenter resigned as manager at St. Louis in 1930 upon completion of his sixtieth year of service. He retired from active participation in Company affairs three years later.

KIRK SALESMAN DIES
