

In view of the Council's expressed opinion that the work of the Associate Committee on Tuberculosis should not be extended into new fields and that steps should be taken to complete the researches under way as soon as possible, the committee considered at length proposals for future work. While recognising the necessity for the strictest economy in the use of funds, the committee nevertheless unanimously decided to recommend to Council the completion of the project under way by Dean Rankin and the continuation of those of Drs. Ferguson, Boudouin and Frappier.

Applications for financial assistance were placed before the executive of the Associate Committee on Tuberculosis at a meeting on August 12 and it was recommended that the following grants be made:

Dr. J.A. Boudouin	5865

The Council has already appropriated \$5000 for the work of this committee, and it is requested that a further appropriation of \$4130 be made in order to provide in full for these recommended grants.
