We just got by in December so January can still be a problem. (see attached)

[REDACTED] must have blood leads in January no higher than 49, 48 & 46 respectively if we are to keep everyone below 50.

We believe the upward surge in blood leads was caused by excessive dusting at the extractor unit; an area all personnel pass going to the lunch room or office.

Modifications have been completed on this extractor unit to prevent dusting and a firm order has been issued to the effect that the unit cannot be operated if there is a generation of dust. We continue to monitor and modify.

Starting in December all employees are required to wear disposable (NIOSH approved) respirators when going to the lunch room from the locker room for any break.
